**RE: Notice of Disclosure to the Department of Justice Office of Inspector General
of Possible Violation of Law, Rule, and/or Regulation Associated
With Senior Official Conduct in a Matter Before the U.S. District
Court for the District of Columbia**

Dear Chairman Grassley and Ranking Member Durbin:

Whistleblower Aid and Compass Rose Legal Group, PLLC jointly represent a former attorney with the Department of Justice who made a protected disclosure to the Department of Justice Office of Inspector General (“DoJ OIG”). Because we have yet to hear from DoJ OIG and given the pressing nature of the issues disclosed, we are informing your Committee of the disclosure. We are doing so in an effort to support the Committee in its oversight capacity and respectfully request that the Committee inquire as to the status of any investigation or action associated with our client’s disclosure.

As background, on May 2, 2025, our client submitted a disclosure to DoJ OIG via the online portal. Later that day, our client sent supporting documentary evidence to DoJ OIG via FedEx.

Discretion counsels against detailing the disclosure with specificity in this letter. However, we can broadly provide you the following information:

Our client provided evidence that established their reasonable belief that senior Department of Justice officials may have violated laws, rules, or regulations – notably with respect to a March 2025 Temporary Restraining Order (“TRO”) issued by the presiding judge in a matter before the U.S. District Court for the District of Columbia. We believe the evidence provided to DoJ OIG may be relevant in developing a chronology of events to determine whether senior officials violated the March 2025 TRO or subsequently misrepresented material facts at issue in that matter.

Given the aforementioned, we request that the Committee inquire as to the status of any investigation or action associated with our client’s disclosure. We thank you in advance for your time and attention to this matter. Should you require any further information, please do not hesitate to contact me directly.
